"I was really excited to join the Bi-borough of Kensington, Chelsea and Westminster to continue the great legacy that it had already created. I look forward to working closely with the Safeguarding Adults Board to ensure that our partnership can support the prevention and early intervention of domestic abuse and it's impact on Safeguarding Adults".

Violence Against Women and Girls (VAWG) is the umbrella term used to describe a range of violent and abusive acts and behaviours, including:

- domestic abuse (including coercive control)
- rape and sexual violence
- female genital mutilation
- early and forced marriage
- so called "honour" based violence
- faith based abuse
- sexual harassment
- stalking
- Trafficking
- prostitution/sexual exploitation

It is called VAWG because it primarily affects women and girls, specifically because of their gender. Notwithstanding, we do recognise that men and boys can be victims too, in some of these issues. So we have a range of services in the bi borough to support female victims and tackle primarily domestic abuse. We are also commissioning a new service for male victims in Westminster. We also recognise that due to the high prevalence of VAWG, some staff may also be victims in their own right and we are keen to support all staff in the workplace and make sure that the correct information is shared accordingly. We still have a way to go and we are really keen to work with you all as professionals. So please feel free to get in touch with me so we can continue this important discussion.

Ending Violence against Women and Girls is a local strategic priority. We have recently launched a new 5-year strategy which builds on our previous work and explains our approach going forward. This partnership strategy has been co-produced by partners, including survivors, residents, and local businesses, and sets out our strategic vision to make our boroughs safe for anyone who is living, working, visiting, and travelling in Kensington and Chelsea.

5 Minutes with Sally Jackson, Partnership Manager, Standing Together



Sally Jackson has over 30 years experience in the Women's sector, working to end violence against women and girls. As Partnership Manager at Standing Together she supports organisations across Westminster and Kensington and Chelsea to improve their response to survivors and hold perpetrators to account. If someone is subjected to abuse it can affect many areas of their lives, their health, their housing, or even their social and community life. We try to ensure that whenever they are able to reach out for help it is there.

Tell us about Standing Together and the work that you do?

Standing Together believes the best response to domestic abuse and violence against

women is the Coordinated Community Response. That means that it's everybody in the community's responsibility to help survivors be safe, and so we help many different organisations and community groups to know how to ask about abuse, respond if someone needs help and where they can get specialist support. We work locally and nationally sharing best practice.

What are you looking forward to this year ?

I'm really pleased that the Safeguarding Adults Board is working with us to share more information for both older people and disabled people who may be more vulnerable to abuse. Together I know we can prevent, protect and support them.

What key messages do you have for our readers?

If you or someone you know might be frightened of a partner or family member there is is help and support available. You can ask for help via your doctor, social worker or many other professionals.
